who self-describes as a depth psychologist, wilderness guide, and agent of cultural evolution. You can read more about him here on is Institute's website https://animas.org/about-us/our-founder/

Bill describes his model for Spiritual Development as having 8 stages, ...but that many Westerners get stuck in what Bill describes as the Adolescent phases - so that Bill sees his life's work as training other soul guides to help people through Stage 4, which is 'Late Adolescence' in his terms 'The Wanderer in the Cocoon - leaving home and exploring the mysteries'.

Bill wants to engage us with 'The Great Turning' by encouraging personal eco-centric development. Joanna Macy says of The Great Turning, "The most remarkable feature of this historical moment on Earth, is not that we are on the way to destroying the world — we've actually been on the way for quite a while. It is that we are beginning to wake up, as from a millennia-

long sleep, to a whole new relationship to our world, to ourselves and each other." There are dynamics in Bill's teachings that could be of interest to many Friends.

Peter Fishpool was one of a group of 20 attending a four day course with Bill in Colorado in October. He will share something of that experience and from his reading of number 2 of Bill's 3 massive books; "Nature and the Human Soul: Cultivating Wholeness in a Fragmented World".

From the Green Group:

Good news: China is reducing the CO2 footprint of its manufactured goods. This, in turn, is reducing the CO2 footprint of goods imported into the UK.

Not so good news: 2017 is on course to be either the second or third warmest year on record. It will almost certainly be the warmest year on record without a major El Nino event.

[Information from Carbon Brief: In Carbon Brief's latest State of the Climate analysis, our projections using six global surface temperature records and two satellite records suggest 2017 will be either the second of third warmest year on record.

While there is no chance at this point that 2017 will be a fourth new temperature record in a row, it will almost certainly be the warmest year on record without a major El Niño event.]

News from Area Meeting:

Two of our projects –

Peacemakers (West Midlands
Quaker Peace Education
Project) and Northfield
Ecocentre – have entered the
Aviva Community Fund
competition, and are asking for
your votes to help them fund
some exciting plans.

Peacemakers are asking for funding to help them develop peaceful communities in Birmingham and the surrounding areas:

A way in which we would like to extend the work that we currently carry out with schools would be to offer these services to a new audience by working with young people in community settings such as youth groups. These sessions would identify what knowledge and skills they need in their lives and concentrate on looking at what peace means to them, how to resolve conflicts peacefully and how to bring about positive change.

In order to carry out these sessions we need to fund trainers, venues, bursaries and materials and a means of promoting our services to reach new audiences and raise awareness. If successful, we would use the funds to develop the work with young people above and to help us be able to respond to more opportunities as they present themselves in our communities.

Northfield Ecocentre is asking for funding to help even more people to learn to cycle through their Cycle South Brum programme:

Last year we taught over 400 people to cycle with confidence and to look after their bikes. It can be difficult for children with hidden conditions, such as autism, to learn to ride, but we believe that cycling is for everyone. We've trialled a project that supports people with autism spectrum disorder, dyspraxia and hypermobility to get on their bikes. Unfortunately, the Aviva website seems to be quite unreliable, so if you can't register at first, please try again.


